

- Fingerprint Searches And Identification For The Nation...
 - 18,000 Law Enforcement Agencies
 - 16,000 Non-law Enforcement Agencies



- Positive Identification
 - 300,000 Searches Per Day
 - 140 Million Prints
- System Accuracy 99.6% / 99.999%
- Performance...
 - TPRS 6-8 Seconds
 - Criminal 6-7 Minutes
 - Civil 15-20 Minutes



RISC SUCCESS



- May 2003; A Drug Deal Went Bad in Georgia.
 - Seller Pulled A Gun And Demanded All The Money. Prospective Buyer Shot The Seller And His Associate.
 - Seller Was Killed; Associate Was Seriously Injured.
 - The Suspects Fled And Were Never Located.

Twelve Years Later:

- FL State Trooper Made A Traffic Stop; Smelled Marijuana; Asked For Driver's License; Noticed A Bank Card With Different Name.
- Officer Used A Mobile ID Device To Search RISC.
- Driver Was Wanted For Murder In Georgia.







LATENTS & PALM PRINTS



- Latent: Three (3) Times Increased Accuracy, Expanded Cascading, And Event Print Searching.
- Expanded Cascaded Searches Producing Results...
 - DOD: ½ As Many ULMs; Twice As Many Hits
 - LAB: In The 16 Years Of Automated Latent Fingerprint Searching, 60% Of The Lab Idents Have Been Since NGI.
- Palm Prints: 29 Million Palm Prints Are Available In The NGI System...
 - More Than 15,000 Per Day Are Being Enrolled.







ULF SUCCESSES



- CJIS and the LAB Searched Major Criminal and Terrorist Latent Prints Against The NGI Database Using The New Latent Matching Algorithm.
- 14,862 Latent Prints From Were Searched.
- NGI Produced 613 Potential Identifications!






COLD CASE SUCCESS

AMBER CREEK







- Child Had Been Sexually Assaulted And Asphyxiated.
- Latent Prints Processed; No Results.
- Prints Searched Against FBI's And OK AFIS.
 - Negative Results; The Case Went Cold.



- 3 Times More Accurate; Searched All Events.
- Ran Prints Through NGI, Identified James Eaton. Evidence Submitted To WI DOJ.
- April 8, 2014, James Eaton Was Arrested For First Degree Homicide And Hiding A Corpse. 40 Year Sentence.

- **TX DPS Tip From NCMEC.**
 - Image of Female Child Being Sexually Assaulted.
- Digital Photograph Prepared and NGI Latent Search 7/30/2015
 - Positive ID on 7/31/2015
- Bossick Arrested...
 - Pled Guilty: Production and Possession of Child Porn.
- Sentenced Imprisonment -- 50 Years.

RAPBACK



- Continuous Vetting Of Persons In Positions Of Trust...
 - Person Is Enrolled At Time Of Employment, Appointment Or Enrollment...
 - Fingerprint Background Check.
 - Fingerprints Searched With Every Criminal Transaction.
 - Subscribing Agency Is Notified Upon Hit (Push Notification).
- States And Agencies Participating...
 - UT, TSA, Fed 1, Fed 2, Fed 3, TX.
- States And Agencies Preparing For FOC
 - AZ, FL, HI, MD, MI, NY, OK, And RI...
 - OPM, ODNI, DOD, DC Police, NRC, FINRA, NMLA, And CSBS.

 - Expect Five States (FL, HI, MI, MD, and TX) And Six agencies OMB, DOD, NRC, FINRA, NMLA, and CSBS to be Enrolled During FY2018.



IRIS PILOT



- A Pilot To Validate The Business Case For Iris Searches.
- Developed Like A Project...



- MOU's For Participation And Bulk Iris Submissions.
- Capable Of Performing Iris Image Searches And Scale Up To Enterprise Service.
- Pilot Participants: DOD, CA DOJ, DHS CBP, TXDPS
 - Completed.
- Deployment Consideration is Underway.

Interstate Identification Index (III)

- III Provides:
 - Computerized Criminal History
 - Criminal Rap Sheets
 - Subject Search.
- Criminal History Responses...
 - III: Retrieves Criminal Histories And Responds To Query.

OR

Outreach: Reach Out To State Files; Obtain The Requested Histories; Respond to the Query
